Freedom of Speech

Most of us are familiar with a fundamental "right" in this country based on the First Amendment which guarantees an American citizen the right of free speech. It allows each citizen to pretty much say or write anything they may choose. There are some limitations such as yelling "FIRE" in a crowded theatre when there is no fire. But basically, no matter how offensive or ridiculous something may be, the right of an American citizen to write or say it is protected.

I believe this is a perfect example of the laws of our land permitting something that God's law limits. Christians have a completely different standard when it comes to what we can and cannot say. Paul wrote in Colossians 4:6 "Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one." The expectation was that a Christian would carefully consider what they said and that they would use wisdom to insure that anything that they might say would have the "proper seasoning."

James described our tongues as a "fire" that could "defile the whole body." (James 3:6) If uncontrolled, the tongue can become an "unruly evil, full of deadly poison." (James 3:8) The very idea that the same mouth that spoke blessings to God could turn around and spew curses to men made no sense whatsoever and was plainly condemned. (James 3:9-10) A simple "in what way will God be glorified by what I am about to say" should govern every word we utter. Our words reflect on Christ as we are His followers.

Many Christians do not even realize that for us to speak evil of another brother, government officials or other authorities is sinful. (James 4:11; (2 Peter 2:10; Jude 1:8) Christians caught up in the web of gossip and "talebearing" (Lev 19:16; Prov. 20:19) are Christians with an uncontrolled tongue spewing the very evil and wickedness that the Bible condemns and warns us about. Congregations, families, friendships, and most importantly souls have been destroyed by the uncontrolled tongues of gossips. I have personally seen this in the families of Elders, Deacons, Preachers, Bible school teachers, and Christians of every walk of life. We know it, we acknowledge it, we understand it, yet we continue to "protect" this vile evil practice. Paul told Titus that the Elders were to "stop" such mouths and the wickedness they spread. (Titus 2:10-11). In fact, Paul says their mouths "must be stopped" as they "subvert whole households." It is one of the great mysteries of my life why these plainly evil people are not dealt with by Godly people. (Gal 6:1)

Regardless, Jesus assures us that God will deal with it. Matthew 12:36-37 "But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the day of judgment. For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

In this regard as well as many others, it is better that we "obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29) when it comes to our speech.
