God Is Behind The Plan

God's scheme of redemption establishes His righteousness. When history has run its course and time is no more God will still be there arrayed in all His glorious power and authority (1 Cor 15:24-28). God was before the plan, relentlessly sustained His plan, providentially and miraculously worked out His plan. In the beginning God's mystery was slowly unfolded for man's redemption. Characteristically God was merciful. If He had not been merciful there would have been no plan of salvation. God's plan was for man to be the caretaker of the earth. God's creation, living in fellowship with Him. God is holy but man tragically was subtlety beguiled into sin and it is not possible for a righteous God to continue in fellowship with sinful man (2 Cor 6:14-19). God had every reason to destroy man, but there was something in God's plan that caused Him to seek and save man. The plan of salvation was via God's mercy and grace. God has not dealt with man according to what was deserved. God is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger and abounds in lovingkindness. He has not dealt with mankind according to their sins and iniquities. God's immeasurable mercy is higher than the heavens, as far as the East is from the West. He is compassionate and mindful of man. Man is like a flower that flourishes and passes away. God is righteous and abideth forever (Psm 103:8-18). There is no merit in man which could call Jesus from glory to the earth and die for mankind. He came because man could not merit forgiveness on his own. Jesus gives a right standing with God to those who are faithfully obedient. The love of God is manifested to us in that He sent His only begotten Son that man might live through Him (1 Jn 4:9, 10). We know that through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, who though He was rich, for man's sake became poor, that man might have the riches of God bestowed upon them (2 Cor 8:8).

In mercy God granted all blessings unto man. In Jesus' Sermon on the Mount He points out the Father's providential blessings. The list of blessings is great. These blessings are accrued to men who seek the favor of God, reaping the spiritual blessings in Christ (Eph 1:3). God gives the essentials of life to sinners in order that they might have opportunity to repent and thus be in favor with the Father. The blessing of being called "children of God" is because of obedient faith and Christ's sacrifice (1 Jn 3:1, 2). The scriptures urge men and women everywhere to present themselves before God as a living and holy sacrifice (Rom 12:1-5). God's mercy permits man to present himself to God. God delights in showing mercy to mankind. Who is like God? Who pardons iniquities? Who retains His anger and waits upon man to repent? Who is full of compassion and casts mans' sins into the depths of the sea (Mal 7:18, 19). The call of God is for man to forsake his unrighteous ways and return to God and He will abundantly pardon (Isa 55:7). God has no pleasure in the death of the wicked. He would

rather that the wicked turn from their ways and lives (Ezek 33:11). God planned the scheme of redemption and is gracious to His creation.

The Bible exalts the wisdom of God and tells man to go to it for understanding. Wisdom's profit is greater than silver, fine gold and precious jewelry. In it is found long life, riches, honor, pleasant ways, peace and the hope of the tree of life (Prov 3:13-18). Acquisition of wisdom teaches man not to turn away from wisdom for it watches over the soul. It is to be embraced and worn like the victor's garland, as a crown of hope and beauty (Prov 4:5-10). Whatsoever God has given demonstrates wisdom. He founded the earth on wisdom and understanding. By God's knowledge the deep was broken up and the skies were filled with dew (Prov 3:19). Wisdom was in the creation and in God's perpetual providence. God's wisdom is beyond that of man. Man must admit that Gods' wisdom is supreme. God can search and try man. God can know man's goings and comings. God knows every language and tongue. God knows of death and where the spirit of man goes. Sheol is not the end of man. Man will take the wings of the morning to the realm of God (Psa 139:1-12). God devised the plan and worked His plan with perfection.

The plan of salvation revealed to the prophets commends the wisdom of God. God chose to hide various things concerning salvation until the last dispensation (1 Cor 2:6-16; Eph 3:1-13; 1 Pet 1:3-12). The secret things belonged to God but in due season He revealed them (Deut 29:29). God has granted all things that pertain unto life by His knowledge and glory (2 Pet 1:3-11). Now the elements of God's plan are fully revealed and we see the wondrous glory of how God redeemed man by the Man, Jesus Christ. God sent Jesus to take away the sins of the world when they respond to God in faithful obedience. Wisdom reflected in the plan of salvation is how God can be just and forgiving at the same time. Mercy which disregards justice would not be mercy. Scripture teaches that the only way God could be merciful in His dealings with sinful man was for Jesus to bear the sins of man upon the cross of Calvary (Isa 53:1-12; Rom 3:23-28). Jesus was publically displayed as the propitiation for mankind and demonstrated God's plan of salvation that He might justify those who have faith and are obedient to Christ. God is just and in His final judgment He will render to all according to their deeds (Rom 2:6; 2 Cor 5:10; 2 Tim 4:1-5).

Who is a Christian? The Bible only makes the determination! A Christian is one that has been born again into the kingdom (John 3:3-5). When one is begotten by the spirit through the word (1 Peter 1:23, James 1:18), and born of water (Ephesians 5:26), he is converted into the kingdom (Matthew 18:3), and is a Christian.

Christians are those who have had their past sins forgiven. Christ says that He forgives sins when one repents and is baptized (Acts 2:38; 3:19). Have you complied with these conditions that your sins might be washed away by the blood of Christ?

One is a Christian who has obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine (Romans 6:17-18). Doctrine or teaching is important for we must obey a certain form or pattern of doctrine to be saved. One must obey the truth to be saved (1 Peter 1:22), and if one obeys the wrong doctrine (error), he will be lost (2 Thessalonians 2:10-12). We must study and make sure we have obeyed the true doctrine.

A Christian is one that in IN Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17). One must be in Christ to have access to all the spiritual blessings, for all are in Christ (Ephesians 1:3). One must be in Christ to be saved, for salvation is in Christ (2 Timothy2:10). To be in the body of Christ is to be in the Church (Ephesians 1:22-23). Therefore, all Christians are in Christ's body, the church (Acts 2:47). The ONLY way one can get into Christ, where there is salvation, is by baptism (Romans 6:3; Galatians 3:27).

Remember, meeting together with fellow saints is a spiritual blessing that should be obeyed and practiced continually. Have a great week serving our true and living God and keeping His commandments. Pray for our sick and shut-ins!

Every Member is Important

Some of the Christians at Corinth had a poor self image. They were "ungifted" and felt inferior to those who possessed the showy miraculous gifts of speaking in foreign languages. They felt "left out" in the church and "unimportant".

Paul used an analogy to deal with this problem. The church, he said, is the body of Christ. Every Christian is a member of this spiritual body; just as the arm and leg are members of our physical body. They are connected and interdependent. The poor self-perception of the "ungifted" is reflected in the text, "Because I am not a hand, I am not a part of the body…because I am not an eye, I am not a part of the body" (1 Corinthians 12:15).

Paul affirmed that every member of the body is important. Every Christian has a place and is needed. To prove this, he asked three rhetorical questions: "If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole were hearing, where would the sense of smell be?...And if they were all one member, where would the body be?" (1 Corinthians 12:22).

Every member was important at Corinth. It is the same today. Those members who perform "unglamorous" jobs are necessary. Those with physical an mental abilities are important. Paul said, "The members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary" (1 Corinthians 12:22).

Instead of being envious or feeling inferior because of our own limitations, we should rejoice that we are all a part of the body of Christ. Our concern should be to do what we can with what we have where we are.
