The Bible Has Influence

A magnificent test of the Bible is what it does to the life and character of those who read and practice what is found in its pages. Ultimately it is aptly stated as "by their fruits shall you know them". In a common-sense manner Jesus asked, "...do men gather grapes of thorns or figs of thistles?" Certainly not! Here is a criterion by which we can determine between false and true. Nature's law and the God of Nature set forth profound details. In the natural and spiritual world all thing reproduce after their own kind (1 Cor 15:35-49). The yielding of fruit is because of the seed bringing forth the plant and ultimately fruit. The law of morals is invariable, in every departure of mankind from the original moral base there is produced a fruit of the vilest nature. This corrupt fruit reproduces after its own kind until the next tree produced by this bad seed yields a corrupted fruit. Judge a tree by its fruit (Mat 7:16-23).

Judging the Bible by its fruits is critical to knowing its values and virtues. A judicial reader can pick and choose what is best for him. The test question is, "what is the fruit of this book?" Does it enlighten or burden, set the soul free or encumber it, are its thoughts good or reprehensive? Does it cleanse the conscience or defile it? Will it contribute to the betterment or worsening of ones being? Does it furnish the preparation for a better future life? A list of the world's greatest books would include fiction, history, poetry, language, natural science, mathematics, philosophies, drama, politics, religion, economics and ethics. The list would be broadened by influences of character and its inclinations towards moral values. Here is the singular fact: no matter how many lists are made inevitably on that list will be the Bible. This is worth emphasizing because it indicates the practical consensus that this particular book is likely to be beneficial inasmuch as it is known for doing good. Repeatedly the merit of the Bible is placed under the microscope of human history. The decisive factor remains, "what are its fruits?"

Fortunately the Bible's fruits are well known. History is abundantly generous to the Bible manifesting that it is a companion of all good and successful endeavors of mankind. The fact that it exists is evidence of its survival of the fittest of all books man has read. It is the one book which the world has known of for centuries and faultlessly it has guided them to better things. Men have not been willing to let this book die. What is the character of those who correctly and

rightly divide it? From the mightiest, martyrs, pioneers, philanthropist, pubic benefactors, renowned for benefits to others the Bible is a companion from which they drew inspiration. Time fails us to name the characters of history who claimed such influences by the Word of God. The "Forefathers of the United States" serve as a rallying point to demonstrate the Bible's influence. We find public documents filled with allusions and quotations from this great volume.

When tested in the life of an average man. Mothers, fathers, families and neighbors who practice the principles of the Bible are better because of applied and teachable values. Is anyone hurt by those of deep devotion to God's word? Are there better people because of His word? Do you know any who plucked a bad fruit from its branches?

What of other books like **Analects of Confucius**? Among those who practice his teachings there are descriptions of the adherents being filled with deception, fraud, lying, quarrelling, slander, cursing, intrigues, brawling, theft, extortion, robbery, piracy, suicide, infanticide, murder and drugs. This is because **Confucianism** is distinctively a moral and not a religious system, avowed to take no notice of God. The Vedas of Brahman in India are among the most shameful and prevalent persons disregarding right and wrong. Their cabalistic [secret or hidden meaning teachings are "I am God! I am God! They live and die with blasphemy on their lips. The Buddhist professes to believe in immortality but believe in Nirvana which is the ultimate extinction of personality. Who wants immortality if there are no remembrances? The pampering of monkeys, paying beggars to propitiate sins and having sacred pigs while allowing others to die of starvation is odd. What of those of Islam, who war, have slavery, believe that the martyred have harems of slave women and that a person can commit suicide if dying in their god's name. By questioning these books we find that when the fruit of their practices is compared to the fruit of a Christian's practices a striking difference is manifested. The Bible is a good influence! When asked the critics of the Bible always profess that it does awe inspiring things for society. Every society guided by its true values has been better. Christians claim to be people doing good in the name of Christ. It is why when Christians depart from the truth Bible-haters have such a "filed-day". Have you ever seen "another infidel has broken the law?" Why not? The Bible's influence!

The Christian religion universally meets all human needs. Such is fundamental and indispensible. God is Omniscient [all knowing] and His nature is to bring to bear upon humans provisions which correspondingly will make them better. Christianity immediately transcends all other religions because it perfectly adapts mankind's senses and reason to the will of God. Christianity is the most sensible religion in the world. Christianity has an influence in the world and will put us in good standing in the next. By allowing the Bible to influence a life, there are eternal blessing ahead.

Mabel and I plan to remain in Devonport and continue to work as retirees in whatever capacity we can. However working at our own pace with less obligations and schedules is inviting to us. We have no idea what new doors the Lord might open for our life, but if He decides to spare us more time in this wonderful world, we look forward to this new chapter in our life. As we look back on our life, we are overawed at how richly the Lord has blessed us. We have been married for 44 fantastic years, our five children happily married to Christian mates, and our twelve wonderful grandchildren. We have also been blessed with a great brotherhood. We especially appreciate all those churches and individuals who have supported us and are presently supporting us over the 38 years we have been working for the church in Australia.

THE LORD IS WITH US

Many individuals in history demonstrate that God in His providence has watched over their lives. One of the most beloved characters in Bible history is Joseph. From youth to death God constantly involved Himself in the blessing of his life. Joseph deserves a few moments to recognize him as a prominent personality who loved and honored God. His life blessed countless others.

One of the most famous parts of Joseph's life was while he was in Egypt. He was recognized by Potiphar, when a young man, as one with integrity. Potiphar admitted God was with Joseph (Gen 39:3). He was placed in charge of the house of Potiphar as an "overseer". The scandalous wife of Potiphar soon sought to involve him in a lurid affair. He said he could not sin against God in such a manner. He was put in prison and while there he was put in charge. He interpreted the dreams of two servants of the Pharaoh who had been imprisoned. One of them, a butler, was restored to his position and when Pharaoh had a dream the butler told Pharaoh only Joseph could interpret his dream. Joseph interpreted the dream and was made second only to Pharaoh. Eventually he had his entire family with him in Egypt. The entire story centers on God's providence in Joseph's life. The Lord was with him. Joseph deserves special recognition among the Patriarchs for his faithfulness and courage. He encourages us to remain faithful in the face of overwhelming obstacles. He was gracious in his victories. His life was a paragon of virtue in which all can rejoice. God's favor was lavished on his family. Because of Joseph the nation of Israel flourished.

Joseph was renowned as a leader who saw his duty and preformed it admirably. He was at the head of a long list of faithful Bible heroes. Moses was one of God's faithful men. Joshua was known for his leadership in the conquest of the Promised Land (Josh 6:27). Caleb, of the tribe of Judah, well advanced in years, took the hard task of the hill country. His military strength manifested God's blessing were upon him (Jdg 1:9). Samuel was called early to the task of a prophet. He is recognized as stately and pious (1 Sam 3:19). The second king of Israel, David, had a cadre of events in his life which demonstrated God was providentially working to see that the nation of Israel was blessed. Others like Josiah, Hezekiah, the prophets Daniel and John the Baptizer all were faithful and blessed by Jehovah. Because of God's blessings these and others were triumphant. Because of their faithfulness God could use them.
