Freedom In Christ

The Bible is unique because it gives the crimson side of mankind's deeds. It is repugnant to many modern societies with their deeds of an unregenerated life because it acts as a mirror and shows them as blood drenched and vile. They view the Bible and renounce it for its graphic portrayal of sinful past generations who sought salvation from their misdeeds through an active participation in the sacrifices required by God. From the moment God took the animal and clothed Adam and Eve there has been a trail of blood which was the purchase price for reconciliation of man with God. The godly reminisce on the access they have through the death of Jesus Christ (Rev 5:9). Acquittal can only be claimed through Jesus' blood. Jesus' death, as bloody as it was, became the bridge over which man must cross to gain reconciliation with God (2 Cor 5:18-20). Apart from man accepting Jesus' blood as the means of salvation there is no acquittal. The Elders from Ephesus were told that they and all Christians were bought with the blood of Jesus (Act 20:28). The price was enormous and frightfully wonderful. "God with us" gave His life on the cross for mankind's salvation. Being alienated from God, without hope and having no covenant, was altered only by the blood of Jesus Christ of Nazareth. There is no other name in which salvation is found (Act 4:12). The price demanded was a perfect sacrifice. Jesus Christ was a man without sin (2 Cor 5:21). God will not demand a second sacrifice (1 Pet 1:18-20). Jesus is the Redeemer (1 Cor 1:30; Gal 4:4, 5). Jesus' blood is contrasted with silver, gold and precious things which man has used as ransom for those taken as prisoners of war (Eph 1:7; 1 Pet 1:18; Rev 5:9). Jesus' redemption is eternal in nature (Heb 9:12). The outpouring of His blood secured redemption.

The mighty acts of God throughout the millenniums are vast and with divine purpose (Eph 1:3-15). Jehovah is the redemptive and covenant keeping name for God of the Old Testament (Deut 7:8). It is from the time of creation that God demonstrated His deep and vast love for mankind's soul. God planned and executed His will to redeem fallen man (Isa 52:3; 53). Jesus came to be the Lamb of God bringing love and forgiveness for lost mankind (Isa 63:9). God aided mankind to find and understand redemption because of their complete inability to save themselves (Psm 49:7, 8). Apart from redeeming grace the sinner was helpless and hopeless (Rom 5:1-10). Nothing but the precious blood of Jesus could avail to save mankind. Fully grasping the voluntary humiliation of Christ, being rejected, His agony, sorrow, brutal mocking, beatings and finally death persuades mankind to surrender to the love of God. The immense

suffering of Christ must captivate the mind of mankind in order for them to surrender to the Lord's divine will.

Christ came to grant an inheritance to all of mankind (Gal 3:24-29). The inheritance is a reward and condition of the soul wherein God allows mankind to have a sonship by virtue of the price paid on their behalf. The reward is to receive full and complete pardon upon obedience to certain biblical precepts (1 Pet 3:9; Heb 1:4; 12:17; 2 Cor 6:14-18). Mankind sells themselves to Satan and are in bondage but Christ sets the captive free (Col 1:11-15). Changing the doctrine changes the message and means of salvation (Gal 1:6-10). Redemption is a matter of receiving the benefits because of obedience to the New Covenant's mandates. When one is without God, any hope or a covenant constitutes them as being lost. To receive the covenant, hope and blessings of God there must be a willingness to put to death the works of the flesh (Gal 5:16-20; Col 3:5-8). Freedom gives an entire change of state and status. Believers enjoy redemption because of the blood of Jesus Christ (1 Pet 1:18; Eph 1:7; Rev 5:9). The effect of redemption is eternal life (1 Jn 5:18). Final consummation of redemption is a heavenly home (Jn 14:1-5). Thus, the blessings and benefits of redemption are varied and vast. Jesus' blood has set us free from the penalty, power and consequence of sin. It frees us from the curse of the law and being in league with Satan (Col 1:12-14). It frees us from the wrath of God and pangs of hell (Rom 1:18-32). Doubt bespeaks of a diminished estimation of the power of Jesus' blood and its value to ransom.

We have been redeemed from all iniquity (Tit 2:14; 1 Jn 1:5-10). We have been redeemed from the power of sin (Rom 6:15-20). Set free to live above a vain manner of life (1 Pet 1:18; Gal 5:17-20). Given power to live apart and eschew all evil (1 Thes 5:21, 22). We can face all circumstance knowing that the Lord will be with us (Matt 28:18-20; Heb 13:1-5). Death has been brought to naught, the power of the devil and the fear of death has been removed (Heb 2:13-18; 1 Cor 15:50-58).

Jesus has brought justification (1 Cor 1:29, 30); Rom 3:24). His grace imparts forgiveness of sin (Eph 1:7; Col 1:14). Jesus' blood purifies a people of God's own possession (1 Pet 2:9). Freedom in Christ sets the heart, mind and soul to seeking His pleasure in all we think or do (Col 3:17). It brings joy and peace (Phil 4:4-7). Because of Jesus' blood we have our name written in His book of life (Phil 4:2, 3). Redemption brings freedom to realize the potential of our lives. Redemption sets us free from the past, gives us strength for today and the prospects of faithfulness in the future. As free, we do use our freedom for a cloak of wickedness, but give God praise (1 Pet 2:16).

These men were so controlled by the Spirit of God that they could not destroy nor mar the message being given through them. Their very words were chosen by the Holy Spirit and not by themselves. (I Cor. 2:12-16).

The Bible is the all-sufficient Word of God. The Psalmist said, "Forever, 0 Lord thy word is settled in heaven" (Psalms 119:89). Isaiah wrote, "The grass withereth, the flower fadeth, but the word of God shall stand forever" (Isa.40:8). Jesus said, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away" (Matt.24:25). The word of God liveth and abideth forever (I Pet. 1:25). God hath given unto us "all things that pertains unto life and godliness" (2 pet. 1:3). Therefore, we are not to add to or take from God's Word (Rev. 22:18-1 9). The Bible is God's final revelation (Jude 3). It is inspired, complete, confirmed, and will judge us in the last day (John 12:48). Do we have new information that has been hidden 2000 years that will change the meaning of the Bible? Brethren, the answer is no!

Attendance is very, very important and we must be meeting with and having fellowship with the saints at every opportunity. Remember our sick and shut-ins in all of your prayers!

Wait for Jehovah

"The mouth of the righteous talketh of wisdom, and his tongue speaketh justice. The law of his God is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide. The wicked watcheth the righteous, and seeketh to slay him. Jehovah will not leave him in his hand, nor condemn him when he is judged. Wait for Jehovah and keep his way, and he will exalt thee to inherit the land: When the wicked are cut off, thou shalt see it. I have seen the wicked in great power, And spreading himself like a green tree in its native soil. But one passed by, and, lo, he was not: Yea, I sought him, but he could not be found. Mark the perfect man, and behold the upright; for there is a happy end to the man of peace. As for transgressors, they shall be destroyed together; the end of the wicked shall be cut off. But the salvation of the righteous is of Jehovah; He is their stronghold in the time of trouble. And Jehovah helpeth them, and rescueth them; He rescueth them from the wicked, and saveth them, because they have taken refuge in him" (Psm 37:30-40).

Occasionally the wicked seem to have success. However, in spite of their apparent triumphs, those who wait on the Lord are the ones who are truly blessed. The word "wait" means binding together. The saint and God are bound together as a child and Father (2 Cor 4:16-18; 6:17, 18; Matt 6:9). As God's own possession we have become His royal priesthood, holy nation wherein He shows forth the excellence of His mercy and grace (1 Pet 2:1-10). We succeed in life because we are not evil-doers but rather are those who seek to glorify God by good works (1 Pet 2:11, 12). We arm ourselves with the same mind that Christ had (Phil 2:1-11; 1 Pet 4:1-6). All of those things which the world strives after will be consumed by rust, moths or taken by thieves (Matt 6:19-33). The day of judgment will find the house of faith prepared to meet God while the unfaithful will watch all things pass away and be dissolved with a fervent heat (2 Pet 3:8-13).

Christianity is not a useless boredom, waiting for something to happen. The end of the Christian's labors will be crowned with success (Matt 25:31-45). When judgment separates the lambs from the goats, the good and bad the King will bid the blessed to enter into a kingdom prepared for them from the foundation of the world. The essence of "waiting on the Lord" is that the saints seek to be prepared to meet the Lord (2 Tim 4:1-5). There awaits the saint a crown of righteousness because for having run the race, kept the faith and loved the Lord.

The promise of the Lord is that His children shall mount up on the wings of eagles (Isa 40:31). Their victory is assured because by waiting upon the Lord they will be renewed in strength and run but not be weary in well doing (Gal 6:9, 10). God comforts His people in all the tribulations of life (2 Cor 1:3-11). Mark out then "perfect man" and behold his uprightness. The end of that one will be peace (Phil 4:1-4). The Lord is our strength and redeemer. He cares for us. He will strengthen in times of trouble. He will deliver the righteous from the hands of the wicked. We can trust in the Lord, He is faithful. Seeking the Lord is a lofty and worthy cause to pursue. The end of this quest will be blessed.
