

Abomination Of Desolation

Things which are abominable to Jehovah are those opposed to the sacred and what is lacking in moral requirements. Those things loathsome and offensive in a religious sense were known as "that which is abominable". Repugnant act of another toward religious practices of the godly were abominable. Actions were looked upon as abominable when other practiced sexual transgressions or unnatural offences which undermined the moral and spiritual ideals of the God of the Bible. These acts were detestable, disgusting, filthy, ceremonially a pollutant, revolting and like a toxin in the community of Hebrews.

While in Egypt the Israelites were considered "abominable" to the Egyptians. The Egyptians were not to eat bread with a Hebrew. It is explained because the Egyptians considered the "cow" the sacred animal among their deities and eating of it was abhorrent to them, whereas the Hebrew raised, ate and sacrificed them in worship. Thus, in the eyes of an Egyptian they were abominable. This was considered a decimation of religious purity when done by other nations who slaughtered their cattle. The Egyptians, fastidiously clean, were disgusted at these foul habits of the Hebrews. Herodotus, a Greek, wrote "The Persian Wars". He observed cultures of many nations and was dubbed the "Father of History". He cited that how the Egyptians treated the Hebrews was common, as in the Genesis account. It reflects accurately the conflict between those who raised and ate the sacred cow (Gen 43:32). Joseph explained to his brothers how to act in the presence of the Pharaoh concerning the occupation they had practiced for many years (Gen 46:34). These nomadic people were to remain in Goshen [a border-land of Egypt] because they were an abomination with whom the Egyptians could not eat. The Egyptians evinced a great interest in raising of cattle as shown in their sculpture and art. They offered the Hebrews care for their cattle (Gen 47:6). The Egyptians detested the lawless habits of the wandering tribes, causing great distrust of the Hebrews.

When Moses was to lead the Israelites into the wilderness, Pharaoh told him to stay in the country and offer a sacrifice to Jehovah. Moses objected saying that it would be an "abomination" and that the Egyptians would be exasperated toward the Hebrews (Ex 8:26). It was the cow which the Hebrews would offer to Jehovah that was the abomination.

The Bible speaks of abominations which offend Jehovah. Idols, the way of the wicked, lying lips, proud heart, evil devices, justifying the wicked, condemning the righteous, offering with impure motives and turning away from hearing the law were abominations before the Lord (Deut 25:14-16; 12:22; 16:5; 15:23; 17:15; Jer 7:10).

The Abomination of Desolation mentioned by Daniel was the filthiness of idolatry and its apparatus used in the Holy Place of God (Dan 11:31; 12:11). To consolidate his empire Antiochus Epiphanes strengthened his hold over the region, deciding to agree with the Hellenized Jews. He outlawed Hebrew religious rites and ordered the worship of Zeus as the supreme god in the temple, on the altar (2 Maccabees 6:1–12). This was an abomination to the Jews and they refused. Because of this the city was destroyed. Josephus [Ant. xii, 7, 6], as do others, declares that this was the Abomination of Desolation prophesied by

Jesus stated that a similar abomination would take place in Jerusalem following His death (Mat 24:15; Lk 21:20). Titus, a Roman general, marched against Jerusalem to destroy it. In 70 AD the prophecy of Jesus Christ came to pass and the Temple Herod had built was destroyed. Jesus' prediction of the Jews being trodden under foot literally came to pass. The zealous Jews who had rebelled against Caligula, the Emperor of Rome, felt his wrath. Titus encircled the city and commanded the city to be burned. The inhabitants of Jerusalem died in great numbers. Titus left not one stone upon another as predicted. The soldiers tore apart the temple to find the gold and the treasury was pillaged. This act rendered the temple unfit for worship. Titus' goal had been to possibly seize the temple, transforming it into a temple dedicated to the Roman pantheon. The account of Josephus describes Titus seeking to spare the Temple. The soldiers were furious with the Jewish resistance and set fire to the apartments adjacent to the Temple, which spread throughout the area destroying the Temple. The slaughter was extensive and dreadful from within and without the city. Young and old, insurgent and priest fought but were hewn down indiscriminately. Offences which destabilize the proper spiritual ideals of the God of the Bible are abominable. These acts are despicable, filthy, unclean, horrendous, toxic and pollutants in the community of Christians (Rev 21:27; 1 Jn 2:18-29).

For he that soweth unto his own flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth unto the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap eternal life. And let us not be weary in welldoing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. So then, as we have opportunity, let us work that which is good toward all men, and especially toward them that are of the household of the faith" (Gal 6:1-10).

Apostle And High Priest Of Our Confession

"Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of a heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, even Jesus; who was faithful to him that appointed him, as also was Moses in all his house. For he hath been counted worthy of more glory than Moses, by so much as he that built the house hath more honor than the house. For every house is builded by some one; but he that built all things is God. And Moses indeed was faithful in all his house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were afterward to be spoken; but Christ as a son, over his house; whose house are we, if we hold fast our boldness and the glorying of our hope firm unto the end" (Heb 3:1-6).

Jesus' willingness to include mankind into fellowship with Him and the Father is because they adhere to the supreme calling of the gospel (Rom 8:27-30). Those redeemed by the blood of Jesus are the family of God (1 Tim 3:14-16). They are made holy by Jesus (Heb 2:11). Because of this Jesus is not ashamed to call them brethren. Those who submit to Jesus are partakers of a heavenly calling [heaven's invitation to the kingdom Rom 11:29; Col 1:13-18; 2 Tim 1:9]. Fixing thoughts on Jesus diligently will indentify that Jesus is the witness of God, the Heavenly Father and a new order of worship where He is the High Priest. Mankind must confess with the mouth that Jesus Christ is the Son of God (Rom 10:10; Acts 8:37). It is noteworthy that the Hebrew writer describes Jesus as our Apostle and High Priest. Jesus was the One sent from God to be His ambassador, proclaiming that the Father is Almighty.

Jesus was faithful to God who had appointed Him and was the builder of the greatest house. This metaphor describes the people of God as a house which is the church of the living God who have spiritual obligations to behave appropriately (1 Tim 3:14-16). The church is to be courageous and hopeful, proclaiming Jesus as the head of the house (Eph 1:22, 23). The purpose of God was completed in Christ who bestowed upon mankind redemption through His blood and the forgiveness of trespasses according to His rich grace, which He made to abound unto all making known the final dispensation (Eph 1:3-14).

Importance is expressed within the scriptures teaching an appreciation of those who have become a part of the house of God (1 Tim 3:14-16). The Lord characteristically intimates the lifting of His name and doctrine as means of keeping Him foremost in the heart, mind and soul. No hostile array of actions will be manifested by those who have such a close contact with God through Jesus Christ. Disregarding or marginalizing holiness and godliness find reasons to complain about God's blessings. Being the house of God and the temple of the Holy Spirit should confirm that the best God could offer was afforded those who seek righteousness above all things. Holy manner of living takes effort and consideration of the high and noble things of life. The warning is not to harden our hearts as in the provocation of Israel (Heb 3:7-19). Let us give diligence to enter into the heavenly rest and with boldness appear before God's throne to receive grace and mercy in times of need (Heb 4:1-16). **Don Hatch**
