### **The Ideal Student**

**Teachers seek an ideal student**. Ideal Students study to show themselves approved unto God and rightly divides the word (2 Tim 2:15). When the mind wonders and contemplates what constitutes an ideal student it finds one who learns and applies what is learned. To make a list of the elements of a good student it would catalog all desirable traits found in the Christian. Personal employment of the value system found in Christianity is a striking part of the disciple's overall aim. Characteristically these individuals seek to find, ask, study and employ what has been taught in their daily lives. The possession of genuine interest, desire to have accurate knowledge, clear thinking, sound judgment, scholarly attitude, ability to concentrate and alert to constructive help are major items in the ideal student.

**Pursuit of excellence is a prominent trait** in an ideal student. Seeking to know, understand and consciously being attentive to the values found in the Bible are distinctive attributes. The one who follows Christ Jesus and adheres to the abiding principles is an imitator of the Teacher (Jn 8:31; 15:8). Ideal students are vigorously mentally aware, have a structured life and do not have a hit of miss approach to life. The ideal student has a definite plan, purposes that compares, contrasts and evaluates Christianity with the world (Tit 2:11-14). Grasping the truth involves more than harboring the thoughts of the Master. It must be employed them in the framework of daily living.

The key to improvement in Christian thinking is an intelligent, adamant and ardent soundness which is not shaken, but steadfastly holds firmly to self-evident truths. The soundness of conclusions reached helps to make further decisions accurate, resolute and unmovable (1 Cor 15:58). The temperament and disposition of the ideal student causes him to keep the Bible at hand as a ready reference which defines life and pursuit of purity. The sum total of ideal qualities is the experiencing of Christian living which grows day by day (2 Cor 4:16-18). Knowing the absurdity of trying to have fellowship with darkness, idols, evil workers and those who make shipwreck the faith gives the ideal student courage to cleanse himself from all defilement of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God (2 Cor 6:14-7:1). Improvement is a matter of positive emphasis on cultivating a sincere love for truth (Jn 8:32). Self-control cannot be minimized, for it is the means toward having the fruit of the Spirit (Gal 5:16-24). Consecration to holiness perpetuates a will to remove undesirable traits and face squarely opposing traits which war against the spirit (2 Tim 2:4).

The ideal student embraces the idea that there will be self-improvement throughout life. Knowing how dependable the student must be is an obligation which cannot be bluffed. A crystal-clear gaze into the mirror, not forgetting who and what the student must be demands putting away wrath, filthiness and overflowing of wickedness, receiving the engrafted word which is able to save the soul (Jas 1:19-27). Ideal students do not forget what manner of person they must be because they have looked into the perfect law of liberty and continue as hearers who are blessed since they apply the ways of God to the keeping of themselves unspotted from the world. Purity, respect for God, high moral standards, unflinching devotion to right, fairness and loyalty bring a dignity to the ideal student's life.

Character education seeks to influence the ideal student to purity, abstaining from all evil and emerges as the Christian ought in all occasions of life. Absolute surrender to Christ as Lord, a vivid sense of what the divine nature requires, escaping from the corruption that is in the world, embraces the virtues of faith, knowledge, self-control, patience, godliness, brotherly kindness and love (2 Pet 1:3-11). Humble growth with a victorious awareness of being more than a conquer in Christ is an ever-present value system which reminds the redeemed that God, Christ and Holy Spirit are for them, thus who can be against them (Rom 8:31-39). Therefore, the genuine conviction concerning the faith brings about a willingness to scrupulously recognize the importance of a deepening love for God and the house of faith.

Spiritually dominant in the soul of the ideal student is a confidence which integrates a willingness to walk closely to God wherein the prayer is "...search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts: and see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting" (Psm 139:23, 24). When the ideal student examines life and its vicissitudes a trust in God is paramount. Undoubtedly allowing inexcusable bad habits, unnecessary worldly influences destroy the effectiveness of a Christian. It is a matter of nurturing and becoming the person which is identified in the Scriptures. Taking courage, going to God in prayer about any deficiency, seeking, overcoming weakness and devoting time and energy to determine strengths and weaknesses with stern self-discipline is an unceasing practice for the ideal student. The task of teachers is to influence strength and improve qualities which perfect the ideal student into an alert, courageous, prayerful, faithful and predictably determined future teacher of the Scriptures. Set yourself determinedly to strengthen yourself. Refuse to be discouraged and progress in self-mastery for Christ (Phil 4:13).
