

Pledges, Declaration of What To Expect

A promise is a commitment to do or not do something. It declares with assurances that one will or will not do something. Individuals or groups commit themselves because they have the capacity to do and contract in exchange for assurances. It can mean that the capacities for goods of similar value are realized in the near future. In law it is a contract, exchange of promises held as legally enforceable.

Promises are varied. An example is the marriage commitment which is based upon a promise of fidelity, purity and a resolute pledge of monogamy. Such legal contracts are enforceable by law. Honor is the basis of such promises. Promises shape many and sundry vows which individuals become guarantors to perform. The commitments individual's pledge to keep are frequently shaped by negotiations in quality, duration and outcome.

A promise is an oath wherein individuals or groups affirm that a notable practice or action is pledged to be accomplished at a certain time. The timing of a completion often is critical to the promise. The promisor gives a document or word to the pomisees that the item in question will have been accomplished at or before the stated time (Gal 4:1-5). Acting or refraining from acting in a specific way is communicated to the other party and is binding on both parties and is the basis of a promise.

In law and contracts the process is offered in order that the community will know of validation or invalidation. The offer given and accepted is a binding contract. Mankind is offered reconciliation, mercy, sanctification, redemption, salvation and other spiritual blessings when they accept the conditions of the New Testament. (Acts 2:1-47). Once acceptance has taken place a binding contract exists and both parties are bound by the terms.

Promises are grounds for hope. Engaging to do, give, make, obligate, gives assurances that the betokened promise is vouchsafed and the words spoken become a bond of responsibility. A breach of promise can be when one of the consenting persons who were to wed reneges and stopped the wedding process. The Bible demonstrates the seriousness of marriage (Mat 1:18-20). God's promise to the church is that they have become the bride of Jesus Christ (2

Cor 11:1, 2; Rev 19:1-10). She is to adorn herself in holy deeds. She will spend eternity in heaven. Accordingly God's word never fails in His promises (Psm 68:11; 77:8). His holy word is His holy promise.

The Greek word for promise is epangelia [επανγελια] which is primarily a law term denoting a summons to an undertaking to do or give something which is promised. There are pledges secured by negotiations, brining remarkable gifts (Acts 23:21). When given they are singularly granted to individuals as a Father upon a child (Acts 1:4). Promises from God are the Holy Spirit, eternal inheritance, reconciliation and other spiritual blessings (Acts 2:23; Eph 1:3-13; 2 Cor 5:18-20). Abraham received the promise of a "seed" (Gen 12:1-5; 15:18; Gal 3:16). Promises made can be conditioned by faith and have a legal framework (Gal 3). The Law of Moses did not annul the promise of Christ's coming (Gal 3:21; 4:23-28; Eph 2:12). The promise of a Saviour who would become our Messiah-Redeemer was bestowed and fulfilled when Jesus Christ was born of woman under the Law of Moses (Gal 4:1-6).

Frequently the word promise was "promises" denoting plural events which will bless (Heb 7:6; 11:3). Christ was the fulfillment of promises made to the fathers (Acts 26:1-3). Abraham stumbled not at the promise (Rom 4:20) and rejoiced when they were fulfilled (Jn 8:56). The children of historical characters became beneficiaries of promises made centuries prior (Rom 15:8; 9:8; Gal 3:29). As heirs of the promises they received them, being conditioned by faith (Heb 11:9; Rom 4:13, 14; Gal 3:12-27).

God announced and proclaimed, through the prophets in advance, His divine will (Heb 1:1-5; 1 Pet 1:10-13; Rom 4:21). The history of Abraham provides an overview of how God promises and fulfills His will with exactness. God has given mankind exceeding and precious promises (2 Pet 1:4; Gal 3:19; Tit 1:2; Heb 6:13).

God's promises are confirmed with His oath (Mat 14:7; Jn 1:20). A mere mental decision is not the bestowal of a benefit. The resolution to give must have a way or mean to accomplish. They prompt action on the part of the promisor. All of God's promises are written and form His word. The authenticities of His promises are His divine nature which is unchanging. Once a promise is clearly considered and offered it becomes a promissory or binding pledge, the declaration of what to expect. God's sincerity in His promises has been proven repetitiously in history. God's promises are not "pie crust, lightly made and easily broken". God will not forget His promises.

Our God Is Able

The word **evil** (Greek kakos) stands for whatever is characteristically base, an unscrupulous influence or vile effect. Evil is in contrast to actions like being fair, worthwhile, good character, useful, beneficial, good act, kind, gracious and serviceable. Evil is morally or ethically wrong (Matthew 21:41; 24:48; Philippians 3:2). It has qualities of emotions and passions coupled with vile deeds (Mark 7:21; John 18:23, 30: Romans 1:30; 3:8; 7:19; 13:4; 14:20; 16:19). Things which are injurious, destructive, baneful, blameworthy and insidious are evil (Luke 16:25; Acts 16:28; 28:5; Titus 1:12; James 3:8). The idea of unprincipled labor, toil causing pain, sorrow, worthlessness, wickedness, loathsomeness, or iniquity belonging to a lower order of things is considered evil.

The conscience is "co-knowledge" (with oneself) as a witness bearing witness to our conduct. God's will establishes the basis of moral government for our lives. Hence, we can have a sense of guilt or guiltlessness directing us by the thought processes when we consider moral good or ill. A conscience trained by God's law is prompted to do good (Romans 2:15; 9:1; 2 Corinthians 1:12). We act in a certain way because conscience requires it and scruples accept or deny (Hebrews 5:11-14). For a conscience to distinguish clearly between lawful and unlawful it must be trained (1 Peter 2:19).

Jesus taught his disciples that a holy life desires to be delivered from the "<u>evil one</u>" (Matthew 6:13). <u>Abstaining from all appearance of evil</u>, resisting the devil and drawing near to God is essential for walking in the light (1 Peter 5:6-11; James 4:7-10). Drawing near in the fullness of faith to God with a true heart enables us to avoid an <u>evil conscience</u>.

Israel would not listen to the "voice of God", hardened their hearts, tried God and brought upon themselves God's wrath. With such an example we should take heed lest haply there arises in us an *evil heart of unbelief*. Sin is deceitful. When we are partakers of Christ we guard our hearts (Hebrews 3:8-19).

By filling our lives with love and purity we can speak truth in love with each other. Deception gains control when we are influenced and lured by *evil companions* to have bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, railing and malice (1 Corinthians 15:33; Ephesians 4:25-32).

Evil works are plots and schemes from which God can deliver us (2 Timothy 4:18). God's rich providence allows us to understand the veneer of evil. Wisdom from above warns of this **present world being evil** (Galatians 1:4; James 3:13-18).

God is able to deliver us from an *evil conscience*, *evil heart* of unbelief, evil companions, evil works and the present evil world (2 Timothy 4:9-18). Trust in the Lord and the strength of his might, "Put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil" (Ephesians 6:10-16).
