A sinner is one who has "missed the mark" and is the usual term used to describe the fallen. It is applicable to all of fallen humanity (Rom 3:23; 5:8; 19; 6:23). Sin signifies any action, purpose, desire, or omission contrary to the law of God. Such violations constitute one a transgressor and sinner.

Now let me share a thought about Going To Heaven written by Brother Ron Boatwright.

Our number one priority in this life must be to go to Heaven. Nothing else is as important. Jesus says in **Matthew 6:33** But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. Our soul is the most precious thing we have. There is nothing that can equal its value. We read in **Matthew 16:26**, "For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" One certainly does not profit in the tragic loss of his soul.

It is easy in today's materialistic society to get caught up in the pursuit of materialism if we are not careful. Our Lord says in **Matthew 6:19-21**, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; ²⁰ but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Our bank account needs to be in heaven.

Every day we need to tell ourselves that the main thing in this life is to go to Heaven. We read in Colossians 3:2 "Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth." We should regularly think about going to Heaven.

Heaven is a prepared place (John 14:2-3) for a prepared people. It will be such a wonderful place, which is beyond our wildest dreams. Paul says in 1 Corinthians 2:9, "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him." There is no way that Heaven can be described so we as mortal human beings can understand how wonderful it will be.

A person will not accidentally go to Heaven. Going to Heaven is a lifelong race as we read in **Hebrews 12:1**, "...let us run with endurance the race that is set before us..." Going to Heaven requires endurance, patience, and persistence. We must finish the race."

The biblical "mystery" reminds Christians that God held the course of human events, shaping them to work for salvation of His people in gracious redemptive ways by divers portions and in divers manners (Heb 1:1-5). Christianity became the fullness of time in which the godly expressed a clear knowledge of whom they had believed and had given their being to for safe keeping (2 Tim 1:12). The plan of God was fulfilled in Christ and the church. Predicted in scripture it came to fulfillment (Rom 16:25-26). God's desire is that all might come to the truth of the knowledge of the Gospel (Rom 10:1-17). Emphasis must be on knowing and being obedient to the will of God and that the mystery was revealed (Rom 16:25-27; Heb 8:8-13).

Mystery Of Godliness

Godliness is right worship or devotion to God in practical religion (1 Tim 4:8; 2 Pet 1:6). Godliness presupposes knowledge, veneration, affection, dependence, submission, gratification and obedience to Divinity. Knowledge is in the mind of those who have searched for and found God. Superstition and vague uncertainties do not satisfy nor quench the thirst of sojourners looking for a superior realm in which to live. Scriptures describe God as knowing all things, even that which the human mind may never know or find unassisted. God knows the secret intentions of the heart of man and the unfathomable secrets of creation (Ps 139:1-4; Mat 6:4; Rom 2:16; Heb 4:13; 1 Cor 4:5). He understands the meaning of human history and its foibles. He understands history because history comprises those things that correspond to His intentions. God willed and it happened. He did so to accomplish His eternal purposes (Dan 3:37; 5:21; Rom 11:25-36; 8:26-30). Humans, because of limitations, remained unaware of God's purposes until He chose to reveal them (Dan 2:27; Mk 4:10-12; Lk 19:41-44). God's response to humans was to reveal His secrets and purposes. When God's purposes are revealed in the Bible they are often called "mysteries".

Godliness requires **rectitude** [integrity] in the conscience of those who seek to please God. Hypocrisy, a vain manner of life, will not stand the test of those seeking unimpaired moral thoughts and values. Godliness in the Old Testament is rendered "godly" and in a literal way, "honored" then "pious" (Psalms 4:3; 32:6). Sometimes in both the Old Testament and New Testament it is employed, "of God," or "according to God." Godliness, as denoting **character** and **conduct**, determined by the principle of love or fear of God in the heart, is the summing up of genuine religion. There can be no true religion without godliness only a dead "formalism" (2 Timothy 3:5). Christ the Incarnation is "the mystery of godliness" revealed. Jesus demonstrated the way in which a person should display a pious life (1 Timothy 3:16).

The mystery of the kingdom, incomplete in the Old Testament, becomes vivid and lucid in the New Testament. The parables of Jesus carried with them practical messages that gave God's eternal plan and simulated the desire to **sacrifice** one's life by renouncing this present world to gain the world beyond. The New Testament defines the "mystery" revealed in Christ (1 Cor 2:1-5). The writers equate the atonement and redemption brought on by Jesus' death as the mystery revealed (1 Tim 3:14-16). It was God's plan through Christ to include Jew, Gentile, bond or free, male and female and make them one new man in Christ (Gal 3:27,28). Moreover, it was God's plan in the mystery to **reconcile** all things to Himself in Christ (2 Cor5: 18; Eph 1:3-15). Thus, the divine mystery revealed in a general sense gave completeness to the teachings of the kingdom, church, redemption and all related subjects.

The New Testament denotes that the mystery was not a mysterious thing but that which, being outside the range of unassisted natural apprehension, was made known in a manner and at a time appointed by God to those whom He inspired by the Holy Spirit. In an ordinary sense it was knowledge **withheld** but in the New Testament it is knowledge **granted** by inspiration. The truth was manifested, preached and zeal for God was implanted.

Christianity is **not** a mysterious religion, better felt than stated. Subjectivism is a false norm in Christianity. One must know how Christianity superintends by overseeing the sacrifices in life. As one renounces the world and its ways for Christianity it is clearly differentiated from meaningless, vain, handed down traditions (Col. 2:8-19)
