

“To Grace How Great A Debtor”

Grace is God’s unmerited, free, unprompted love for sinful man, revealed and made effectual by the death of Jesus Christ on the cross of Calvary. Grace in the Bible context is something that is God-given, made possible only by Jesus Christ and none other. It is God's gift of salvation granted to sinners for their redemption, salvation and sanctification (1 Cor 1:18-31). The biblical teaching of grace is unmerited favor that God gives to all of mankind. He seeks them while they are “yet in their sins” (Rom 5:1-11). Grace grants eternal life (1 Jn 5:13). Grace is a state of kindness or favor toward another with the focus on being beneficial. Grace is precious and a blessing. The Bible teaches that this spontaneous gift of divine favor, manifested to mankind, is an uncaused free gift stemming from God’s overflowing love and mercy, totally undeserved by mankind. Each person has the option to accept it or reject it and a responsibility for continuance in the relationship it affords. Grace is not irresistible. One can fall from grace after being redeemed (Gal 5:4; 2 Tim 4:10; 1 Jn 5:13-17; Heb 6:1-5). Grace is God’s gift. Man cannot earn it nor induce God to grant it. It is God’s desire and initiative. **It is in no sense something earned by works** (Eph 2:8-10; Rom 4).

Mankind is in a position to accept or reject God’s grace, but is not in a position to return the favor to God or pay Him back for His grace. Man is only a recipient of favor which is undeserved. God is not in debt to mankind for anything. The favorable removing of the stain of sin from mankind is based upon the atonement of Christ, not by any attainment of mankind, or achievement only, but faithful obedience (Rom 1:1-5). God gives grace to mankind because of His love (1 Jn 3:1-5). It is granted because of the atonement of Jesus Christ on His cross (Rom 3:21-30). An awareness of this sacrifice makes mankind realize that the tremendous price and plan of God is the most valuable blessing bestowed upon a lost and sinful individual. In principle grace transcends all notions of “rule keeping”, thus demanding of God salvation (Mat 19:16-23). No man can do enough to earn salvation. This does not remove the responsibility to be God’s “workmanship created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God afore prepared that we should walk in them” (Eph 2:9, 10).

Grace is based upon divine forgiveness and spiritual blessings previously unheard of until Christ Jesus came (Jn 1:1-17). This idea of

divine merit is contrasted with human accomplishments. God paid the redemptive price for man. Christianity’s redemption is foreign to all other religions in the world. None have invented a religion whose god suffered and died as the basis of salvation for the creatures created by that god. Salvation was made possible for mankind by Immanuel, God with us (Mat 1:18-20; Phil 2:1-11). The idea that God freely gives an unmerited favor to His creation, making forgiveness from sin a reality is magnificent. God’s plan was carefully crafted through the ages wherein He made covenants with men and in the last dispensation made a covenant with mankind by the blood of Christ Jesus. Christianity is a “grace religion”. All former dispensations introduce how God planned and perfected this redemption (2 Cor 5:18-20).

Many distortions seek to manipulate the doctrine of grace. Grace without responsibility destroys moral and spiritual integrities without which the doctrine of grace cannot stand. Mankind has a responsibility to be obedient to God. Ceremonies and religious practices do not merit grace. Grace does not depend upon man’s effort alone. Many hold that it is largely man’s own merit which saves. The emphasis in this teaching is “law keeping”. Laws of God must be kept, but law keeping does not supersede grace. Mankind keeps the law of God because God demands it. Not keeping God’s law is “antinomianism” [a doctrine or belief that the gospel frees Christians from required obedience to any law, whether scriptural, civil or moral and that salvation is attained solely through faith and the gift of divine grace]. Such teachings are fallacious and vile. Denying that there are binding obligations that must be obeyed makes grace cheap with no need for obedience. Extremes contradict grace. Grace and obedience are interlaced and impossible to escape, therefore both are demanded. The New Testament sets forth the salvation which comes through Christ, as “by grace have you been saved through faith” (Eph 2:8).

We are debtors to grace. Daily we should be constrained to feel a responsibility to bind our hearts to God through Christ Jesus, never wandering from the fold of God. Jesus sought us while going astray. He rescued us from danger and interposed His own blood to bring us into God’s favor. Grace is like a fount with streams of mercy, never ceasing, which call for our fervent praise. Let us pray that it fixes our sight on the goal of the high calling in Christ (Phil 3:13-16). It is not the labor of our hands which can fulfill the law’s demand. Christ’s love for us should prompt zeal which knows no respite from the labor in the vineyard of the Lord. All our labors for sin cannot atone, only Christ and Him alone. **Nothing we possess is greater than the cross of Jesus.** It is to that we must cling and His shed blood cleanses us from our sin. The old hymn “**Come Thou Fount Of Blessings**” still resonates a message of saving grace.

A Message from Our Shepherds

I would like to share with you an article written by Mark W. White. It is entitled "The Lord Will Provide." It is certainly something we need to understand as we journey through this life.

"Young Isaac was perplexed. Doubtless, he had seen his faithful father sacrifice burnt offerings to Jehovah before, but this time was different. *"My Father! Look, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?"* said Isaac (Genesis 22:7). Abraham said, *"My son, God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering."* For a little while, at least, this must have set the boys mind at ease. Little did he know that **he** was God's provision.

God provides. He always has, and always will. As a prime example of fatherhood, He is providing for His children. This is what is meant by God's **providence**.

We are in deep water when we discuss such a magnificent subject. It is doubtful that any man can fully understand or comprehend the ways in which God makes His provisions for us. But our inability to fully see how god's providence works does not make an anachronism of such providence. I may not fully understand electricity. Yet my failure to understand it completely does not prevent me from using its power. Neither do I deny it exists. Just because I cannot explain its workings in detail does not mean it is of no benefit to me. And so it is with God's provisions for both my body and spirit. The English word **providence** appears only once in the King James Bible. Tertullus, the orator commended Governor Felix for his providence toward the Jewish nation. The New King James uses the word **foresight** which really gets to the heart of the meaning of the Greek word.

God's foresight for His creatures is taught throughout Scripture. God asked Job, *"Who provides food for the raven?"* (38:41). In His mountain sermon, Jesus expands these provisions beyond the natural world for men and women who see God's kingdom (Matthew 6:25-34). Rather than make the sum of our lives a frantic search for food, clothing, and shelter, Jesus teaches we should remember that our Heavenly Father knows we have these needs! All these things (food, clothing, shelter) which God provides for the birds of the air, and the lilies of the field will also be provided for us if we serve God first. Why is this so? Man is more valuable to God than birds and flowers! (v. 26). Jesus is not endorsing laziness, slothfulness, or a "welfare" mentality. But he is trying to get us to see the necessity of faith in God - faith that He will provide if we serve Him faithfully and expectantly. It is faithless to expect anything less from our Father. Could we dare think our Father would abandon His children and leave us to fend for ourselves? How unthinkable! ~Jerry McKey

God made foolish the wisdom of the world. In this wisdom, which is from above, vile deeds are replaced with purity, peacefulness, mercy and good which is without variance (Jas 3:13-18).

The way of salvation is a straight and narrow way (Matt 7:13, 14). The broad way leads to destruction. Many follow the broad way, where few enter the narrow gate and find life everlasting at the end of life's solemn journey. The Scriptures describe the doom of sinners, and the hope of believers. The doctrine of holiness is a state or quality of being holy. Christ gave His life that all could become holy in the sight of God. The Scriptures uniquely join history and providence to demonstrate the immutability of God (Heb 6:13-20). God's decisions are incontrovertible filled with hope and joy.

Read the scriptures to be wise, **believe them to be secure**, and **practice them** to be consecrated unto God.

The **Book of books** contains perfect direction for life eternal. Feed upon it from a baby to eternity, let it support you and comfort you along life's way. **The Bible is a lamp** unto thy way and a map for your pilgrim's travels.
